


POWER BOATS



BENETEAU

Following on the huge success of their Swift Trawler 34 during the past eight years, Beneteau is offering a successor, the Swift Trawler 35. At 10.5 metres in length, it features more modern styling and added indoor and outdoor volume. As with its predecessor, there are lots of innovative uses of space, including an improved galley design; the flybridge settee now has room to seat six and there's a unique folding transom door arrangement to expand the cockpit space. While some of the best features of the 34 carry over, there's plenty more to see in the new 35. Power is from a single 425-horsepower Cummins diesel. There is a review of the Beneteau ST30 in the June 2017 issue of PY. Beneteau's Gran Turismo line has a new flagship, the GT50, available in both flybridge and sedan models. The hull features Beneteau's Air Step planing and is powered by twin Volvo IPS 600s. One of the unique



features is the ship control system, which makes it simpler than ever to check gauges and manage ships systems. beneteau.com

Features include versatile seating arrangements with bow seating with room for a table and sunshade. Inside is a V-berth, microwave and fully-enclosed stand-up head.
